


# Use the Confluence Add-On Hide Elements

 If you need to hide Confluence page elements (e.g., title, comments), use the HideElements Add-On for Confluence

## Step-by-step guide

1. Hide Elements provides macros for hiding corresponding Confluence page elements to display a cleaner page.
2. You need to have Edit permission to a page in order to use Hide Elements.
3. **Be aware that this Add-On provides no security.** Users who can view the page may be able to see the hidden page elements using web developer tools.
